## Thought for the Day

The inspiration for this component of the Teamwork & Teamplay cards comes from the creative genius of Kirk Weisler (kirkweisler.com). You can use these wonderful quotations as an opening activity by presenting each person with a card and inviting them to meet others, share their quote, trade cards and continue this process for a few minutes. At the end of the activity, invite several people to share the quote they found most significant.

You can further use these quotations to explore the character words and themes found on each card, and as a closing activity by asking your group to select the quote that most accurately describes or inspires them at the completion of the program. Kirk also suggests that you can select quotes that speak to a need you see in your team's future or one that can be used as a focal theme when your group returns to the workplace or classroom.

## The Big Question

Of all the words your friends use to describe you, which one is your favorite?

The three different colors reflect three different levels of ice-breaking questions on each card. Question 1 (red) is the beginner level and can be used when most participants do not know each other. Question 2 (blue) is the intermediate level. Question 3 (green) is the advanced level, and should be used with groups that are familiar and well acquainted with each other. To facilitate The Big Question, present one card to each participant and instruct them which level (color question) the group will be playing. Invite each person to find a partner. Next, one person in each pair reads the question on their card and their partner answers it. Then the second person reads their question, and the first person answers it. When the conversation is complete, these two people trade cards (so they each have a new question card), and raise the card high into the air above their heads. This is the universal sign for "I am looking for a new partner." When new partners are found, the process begins again.
