Visual Explorer comes in several different versions:

- Letter-Size Set 2 x 108 image cards (22cm x 28cm), with instructions, suitable for groups of up to 24 people
- Post Card Set 3 x 72 image cards (15cm x 10cm), with instructions, suitable for groups of up to 24 people but are at their most effective when used in a small group setting
- Playing Card Set 4 x 54 image cards (6cm x 9cm), with instructions, suitable for groups of up to 24 people but work best in more intimate groups and in one-on-one situations

A separate extensive hard copy Facilitator's Guide (112 pages) is available for purchase.

Developed by the Centre for Creative Leadership (CCL), Visual Explorer is a set of 216 images, in several sizes, that can be used to facilitate creative discussions on any leadership topic. Using abstract images, metaphors, emotions and intuitions, Visual Explorer can kick-start discussions that should help tackle important issues that could arise in any environment and can be used when seeking a variety of perspectives, eliciting stories and metaphors and imagining alternatives.

Because of its versatility and ability to engage all kinds of people, VE is widely used in organizations, communities, schools, and coaching relationships, with the outcome of better conversations about things that matter. Visual Explorer is especially useful when a situation is complex and when a variety of perspectives and social boundaries need to be spanned.

- To build bridges between people despite their differences
- To tackle important issues in the office
- To gain new perspectives on different situations
- Performance reviews and evaluation
- Developing visionary business strategies
